Sal, Cape Verde 15 -17 December 2004.

Workshop on FANS 1/A (ADS/CPDLC) Operational Implementation.

(Presented by Spain)

SUMMARY

The Spanish Air Navigation Service provider, Aena, is organising a two day Workshop on FANS 1/A (ADS&CPDLC) Operational Implementation. The Workshop is targeted at experts from states, organizations and airlines involved or planning to be involved in this specific matter.

1. Background.

- 1.1 The Spanish Air Navigation Service provider, Aena, is carrying out FANS 1/A ADS/CPDLC operational evaluation trials with aircraft in the Canarias airspace since 15th August 2002.
- 1.2 Lufthansa, Air France, Lan Chile, TAM, etc. and more than one hundred air traffic controllers from Canarias ACC have participated in the trials that still go on.

2. Workshop.

- 2.1 Aena is organising a two day workshop on **FANS 1/A (ADS&CPDLC) Operational Implementation** on 26-27 April 2005 at Canarias ACC in Las Palmas, Spain.
- 2.2 The overall objective of the workshop is to obtain feedback from states, organizations, service providers, airlines, etc. involved in FANS 1/A (ADS/CPDLC) operational implementation.
- 2.3 This workshop will be the first occasion for Aena to present results of the "FANS 1/A ADS/CPDLC Operational Evaluation Trials being carried out in the Canarias FIR/UIR". Presentations by Aena will also include "The SACCAN System" and "The Canarias ADS/CPDLC Evaluation and Implementation Plan".
- 2.4 Visits to the operation room to observe operational evaluation trials being carried out with overflying aircraft will be organized conveniently.

- 2.5 Have a clear picture of current and planned implementation in the AFI and SAM regions, and specially in the EUR/SAM corridor, is a most important goal of the workshop. Presentations from Cape Verde, Dakar, Brazil, etc. would be high appreciated.
- 2.6 The workshop is also being held in response to Aena's recognition that only regional implementation together with a high proportion of aircraft equipage can provide full benefits. It is hopped that presentations to be made will promote both ground and aircraft equipage at regional level.
- 2.7 The workshop should also provide a platform for working level expert discussion to:
 - Establish cooperation agreements in order to share experience, documentation and information related to FANS 1/A (ADS/CPDLC) operational implementation;
 - Agree to the creation of a Regional Group for the Operational Evaluation/Implementation of ADS and CPDLC in the EUR/SAM corridor. Spain (Canarias), Cape Verde, Dakar, Brazil, etc. should be in it;
 - Agree on material to be taken on board for the "development of operational guidance material with a view to ensuring harmonization and standardization of ADS/CPDLC applications (as in the terms of reference of the task force established by the SAT/11 meeting)".
- 2.8 <u>Presentations to be made</u> at the workshop and <u>pre-registration for attendance</u> is being coordinated by the Workshop Planning Committee:

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2.9 Since the number of participants in the workshop will be limited to not more than sixty, preference will be given to those directly involved in FANS 1/A (ADS&CPDLC) Operational Implementation. Please provide full details on your type and degree of involvement when pre-registering.

2.10 You are cordially invited to pass this information to any relevant experts and representatives from states, organizations and airlines involved or planning to be involved in FANS 1/A (ADS&CPDLC) Operational Implementation.

3. Conclusions.
