This paper presents the Recommendations of the AFI/7 RAN Meeting, the Special AFI/08 RAN Meeting, and the Conclusions and Decisions formulated within the frameworks of APIRG, for review, follow up action, and update as necessary by the Task force.

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 The meeting will recall that the AFI/7 RAN meeting adopted a comprehensive set of eight Recommendations, aimed at fostering implementation of current and future requirements in the SAR field.

1.2 The Special AFI/08 Regional Air Navigation Meeting convened in November 2008, formulated Recommendation 6/22 *'Establishment of sub-regional search and rescue (SAR) arrangements'*. Moreover, the APIRG/17 meeting in August 2010 adopted Decision17/67 and Conclusion 17/68 which are directly applicable to the work of the ASSI Task Force.

2. DISCUSSION

2.1 While recognizing the lack of effective implementation of AFI/7 RAN recomandations and ICAO provisions for the SAR field in general, the SP AFI/08 RAN meeting noted also that the historical approach to SAR system development had rested on the

establishment of independent national SAR services, which prompted ICAO and the International Maritime Organization (IMO) to recommend the regionalized provision of SAR services as the most expeditiously means of achieving an effective global SAR system. The meeting further noted that regional SAR service provision provided the opportunity for aeronautical and maritime agencies to cooperate in the provision of SAR services.

2.2 The APIRG/17 meeting was of the view that the implementation of SAR was not receiving the attention it deserved, and that a concerted effort was necessary to give maximum effect to the Conclusions of APIRG and the AFI RAN Recommendations.

2.3 APIRG/18, upon considering the challenges that were impeding SAR implementation progress in the AFI Region, agreed that the single most prominent hurdle was the establishment of agreements. The meeting also acknowledged that the establishment of international agreements was the key to effective implementation and consequently urged States to focus on the issue of bilateral and multilateral SAR agreements to facilitate cooperation.

2.4 The Group also noted that issues related to SAR integration could still take some time to be implemented and that challenges ahead included the lack of political commitment, differing interpretations of sovereignty and political complexities in establishing international agreements. Sensitization of high level State officials on SAR matters was considered essential to successful implementation.

2.5 In accordance with Decision 17/67 of APIRG 17, the ASSI TF was established and the first and second meetings thereof were held respectively in Dakar, Senegal, 19 - 20 September 2011 and Nairobi, Kenya, 5-6 December 2012. The ASSI TF1 meeting adopted three draft conclusion and one decision which are reflected in **Appendix A** to this paper.

2.6 As per its Terms of Reference, and in accordance with established procedures, the ASSI TF reports to the ATM/AIM/SAR Sub-Group which on its turn reports to APIRG. Since the ASSI TF/1 meeting, the Sub-Group did not have the opportunity to meet. The ASSI TF/2 meeting was of the view that conclusions and decision adopted by the ASSI TF/1 meeting were still valid and decided to renew them for presentation to the ATM/AIM/SAR Sub-Group and endorsement.

2.5 The meeting may wish to review these recommendations, conclusions and decisions and decide on any follow-up action deemed appropriate, in order to expedite their implementation.
