




U.S. Air Force - aeronautical SAR on land

One rescue coordination center, agreements with states/local governments, and also makes use of general aviation for searching
 U.S. Coast Guard – maritime SAR regions and aircraft accidents in those maritime regions

Note: Local governments do most of the local SAR on land, such as missing persons,

Typical Maritime SAR Scenario





Typical Sector Resources

- >3 to 4 boat stations
- >6 to 8 search and rescue vessels
- 5 to 10 VHF-FM radio towers (no Medium Frequency (MF) on shore unit)
- ▶1 <u>air station</u> with 4 to 5 <u>aircraft</u> to provide air support for several sectors
