Benefits of agreements

- Both parties know what to expect of the other
- Clearer procedures more efficient operation
- More chance of successful test transmissions
- Improved SAR service within a State
- Improved SAR system globally

IAMSAR Manual, Volume I (Doc 9731) contains guidance on SAR Agreements throughout, and a sample agreement in appendix I





The MCC will:

- provide distress alerts and location data;
- provide updates on the Cospas-Sarsat system status; and
- consult with the SPOC to ensure implementation of the agreement.

What is in the agreement?

Or, "What am I signing up for?!"

The SPOC will:

- receive distress alerts and location data;
- develop a plan for distribution of alerts to SAR authorities within its SRR;
- respond to monthly communications test; and
- provide updates to contact details as appropriate.





What is needed for an Agreement?

- Will desire to improve the SAR service/system
- Understanding all parties know what the others need
- Cooperation all parties work together
- Action all parties sign
