EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This discussion paper presents the proposed revisions of the AFI Plan projects. These projects were approved by the Steering Committee at its 17th, 20th and 22nd meeting in May 2016, December 2017 and May 2019, respectively.

Action: The Steering Committee is invited to:

- a) note the information contained in this paper;
- b) consider and approve the implementation of the proposed projects;
- c) call on States, international and regional organizations, financing institutions; and industry to support the AFI Plan projects; and
- d) provide further instruction and guidance as necessary.

1. Introduction

1.1 At its 17th meeting, the AFI Plan Steering Committee (SC) approved the implementation of projects related to Aerodrome Certification, Air Navigation Service Provider (ANSP) Peer Review, State Safety Programme (SSP) Implementation and Search and Rescue (SAR) Organization.

1.2 At its 20th meeting, the SC approved the implementation of projects related to fundamentals of safety oversight (FSO) and aircraft accident and incident investigation (AIG). 1.3 At its 22nd meeting, the SC approved the implementation of an additional project related to aeronautical information management (AIM).

1.4 This paper presents proposed revisions of these projects for implementation and funding consideration under the AFI Plan for the year 2022 and beyond.

2. SUMMARY OF PROGRESS UNTIL 2021

2.1 The summary of progress of each project is provided in the Project Documents in the Appendices.

3. SUMMARY OF REVISIONS FOR 2022 AND BEYOND

- 3.1 The following revisions are proposed to the AFI Plan projects:
 - a) The consolidation of Aerodrome certification projects WACAF/2016/007 and ESAF/2016/004 into a common project document AFI/2022/001;
 - b) The consolidation of Search and rescue projects WACAF/2016/005 and ESAF/2016/002 into a common project document to be submitted to the next Steering Committee meeting for consideration.
 - c) The scope, timelines and budget of the individual projects have been updated to take into account the achievements realized so far.

3.2 The revisions are summarized in Appendix A to this paper. It is to be noted that the AIG project is no more included due to the availability of another source of funding of the related activities and the SAR Project is under review for presentation to the next Steering Committee meeting.

3.3 As a result of the revisions, funding of US\$ 729,747 is sought to cover AFI Plan project activities until October 2024. Considering the importance of States' needs in the AFI Region and the evolution of GASP objectives and goals, the Secretariat adopted a conservative approach for the planning horizon in developing these proposals, in line with the current extension period of the AFI Plan.

3.4 The individual project revisions are included in Appendices B through F.
