**UN 3291**

**SUMMARY**

This paper proposes to clarify the applicable proper shipping names for UN 3291.

Action by the DGP is in paragraph 1.3.

**1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 Part 2;6.3.5.2 states:

6.3.5.2 Medical or clinical wastes that are reasonably believed to have a low probability of containing infectious substances must be assigned to UN 3291.

*Note.—The proper shipping name for UN 3291 is **Clinical waste, unspecified, n.o.s.** or (**Bio**) **Medical waste, n.o.s.** or **Regulated medical waste, n.o.s.***

1.2 A review of Table 3-1, Dangerous Goods List and Chapter 1 of Attachment 1, List of UN Numbers With Associated Proper Shipping Names, indicates four proper shipping names for UN 3291. These being:

**Biomedical waste, n.o.s.  
Clinical waste, unspecified, n.o.s.  
Medical waste, n.o.s  
Regulated medical waste, n.o.s.**

1.3 As the terms in Part 2;6.3.5.2 are in bold, cargo acceptance staff for which English is not their native language may experience confusion as which terms are acceptable.

2. **ACTION BY THE DGP**

2.1 The DGP is invited to discuss if the proper shipping names **Biomedical waste, n.o.s.** and **Medical waste, n.o.s** are acceptable or should only **(Bio) Medical waste, n.o.s.** be used without any variation.

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
