**ENVIRONMENTALLY HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES AND AEROSOLS**

(Presented by the European Aerosol Federation (FEA))

**SUMMARY**

This paper proposes that UN numbers 3077 and 3082 be added to Special Provision A112 in order to permit them to be carried as consumer commodities (ID 8000, **Consumer commodity**) in the *Technical Instructions for the Safe Transport of Dangerous Goods by Air*.

Action by the DGP is in paragraph 2.

**1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 Many substances that used to be classified as Class 3 or Division 6.1 have in recent years been reformulated to remove the flammability and toxicity criteria. However, many still meet the criteria of being dangerous in transport but are now classified in Class 9 as UN 3077 — **Environmentally hazardous substance, solid, n.o.s.** and 3082 — **Environmentally hazardous substance, liquid, n.o.s.** The European Aerosol Federation (FEA) proposes that these two UN numbers be permitted as **Consumer commodities**.

**2. ACTION BY THE DGP**

2.1 The DGP is invited to agree to add UN 3077 and 3082 to Special Provision A112 as follows:

A112 Consumer commodities may only include substances of Class 2 (non-toxic aerosols only), Class 3, Packing Group II or III, Division 6.1 (Packing Group III only), UN 3077, UN 3082 and UN 3175, provided such substances do not have a subsidiary risk. Dangerous goods that are forbidden for transport aboard passenger aircraft must not be transported as consumer commodities.
