### AMENDMENT TO A112 FOR CONSUMER COMMODITIES

## 1. **BACKGROUND**

1.1 Currently certain dangerous goods may be transported as consumer commodities even though they are forbidden on passenger aircraft. Examples include: **Aerosols** flammable (engine starting fluid), UN 1950, **Chloropicrin, mixture, n.o.s.**, UN 1583, **1-Chloropropane**, UN 1278, **Elevated temperature liquid, flammable, n.o.s.**, UN 3256. It is proposed that dangerous goods that are forbidden for transport on passenger aircraft should not be permitted for transport as consumer commodities.

# 2. **PROPOSAL**

- 2.1 The Panel is requested to consider adding a new sentence in A112 as follows:
- A112 Consumer commodities may only include substances of Class 2 (non-toxic aerosols only), Class 3, Packing Group II or III, Division 6.1 (Packing Group III only) and UN 3175, provided such substances do not have a subsidiary risk. Dangerous goods that are forbidden for transport aboard passenger aircraft may not be transported as consumer commodities.
