AMENDMENT TO A112 FOR CONSUMER COMMODITIES

(Presented by R. Richard)

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 Currently certain dangerous goods may be transported as consumer commodities even though they are forbidden on passenger aircraft. Examples include: **Aerosols** flammable (engine starting fluid), UN 1950, **Chloropicrin, mixture, n.o.s.**, UN 1583, **1-Chloropropane**, UN 1278, **Elevated temperature liquid, flammable, n.o.s.**, UN 3256. It is proposed that dangerous goods that are forbidden for transport on passenger aircraft should not be permitted for transport as consumer commodities.

2. PROPOSAL

2.1 The Panel is requested to consider adding a new sentence in A112 as follows:

A112 Consumer commodities may only include substances of Class 2 (non-toxic aerosols only), Class 3, Packing Group II or III, Division 6.1 (Packing Group III only) and UN 3175, provided such substances do not have a subsidiary risk. **Dangerous goods that are forbidden for transport aboard passenger aircraft may not be transported as consumer commodities.**
