**ADDITION OF “COSMETICS” TO PART 7, CHAPTER 6
(PROVISIONS TO AID RECOGNITION OF UNDECLARED
DANGEROUS GOODS)**

1. BACKGROUND

1.1 It has recently come to our attention that certain consumer cosmetics, which may qualify as dangerous goods, are commonly being offered to air carriers for transport as non-hazardous goods. "Cosmetics" is a broad term that includes such items as finger nail polish and nail polish remover, both of which may contain flammable liquids. In addition, other types of cosmetic products are flammable aerosols or other articles that may qualify as dangerous goods.

2. PROPOSAL

2.1 Add the following entry and definition to 7;6.1:

cosmetics — may include flammable liquids or be in the form of flammable aerosols or articles. Examples include finger nail polish and nail polish remover.

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
