**CONTAMINATION OF PACKAGES DURING FILLING**

**SUMMARY**

This paper proposes an amendment to Part 5;1.1 in order to provide a provision for ensuring that there is no external contamination on surfaces of assembled packages.

Action by the DGP-WG is in paragraph 2.

**1. INTRODUCTION**

1.1 Airlines have reported incidents where packages filled with dangerous goods are externally contaminated during filling. This applies particularly with single packagings containing liquids and powders. Apparently there have been reports of this type of contamination for some years.

1.2 The nearest reference to external contamination is in Part 4;1.1.1, second last sentence, which states:

“No dangerous residue must adhere to the outside of packages during transport.”

1.3 It is believed that this is insufficient in that it does not require positive action by the shipper to “wipe clean” or otherwise remove any contamination from the external surface of assembled packages.

**2. ACTION BY THE DGP-WG**

2.1

The DGP-WG is invited to agree to:

- a) add a new paragraph d) to Part 5 – Shipper's Responsibilities, Chapter 1, 1.1 General Requirements as follows:

d) external surfaces of assembled package(s) are clean of contamination arising from the filling process itself or from contamination from the environment surrounding the filling/assembly area;"

- b) renumber subsequent paragraphs, e) through k) to become f) through l) respectively.
