SUMMARY

This working paper proposes to add a note under "Table 7-1 Segregation between packages" to indicate that packages containing Division 4.1, Classes 6, 7 or 9 dangerous goods do not require segregation from other classes or divisions.

Action by the DGP-WG is in paragraph 2.

1. **INTRODUCTION**

- 1.1 Table 7-1, Segregation between packages, has no information regarding the segregation of packages containing Division 4.1, Classes 6, 7 or 9 dangerous goods.
- 1.2 We recommend that a note be added indicating that dangerous goods of Division 4.1, Classes 6, 7 or 9 do not require segregation from other classes or divisions.

2. **ACTION BY THE DGP-WG**

2.1 The DGP-WG is invited to consider adding the following Note 4 under "Table 7-1 Segregation between packages":

Note 1.— See 2.2.2.2 through 2.2.2.5.

Note 2.— This class or division must not be stowed together with explosives other than those in Division 1.4, Compatibility Group S.

Note 3. — Packages containing dangerous goods with multiple hazards in the class or divisions which require segregation in accordance with Table 7-1 need not be segregated from other packages bearing the same UN number.

Note 4. — Packages containing dangerous goods of Division 4.1, Classes 6, 7 or 9 do not require segregation from other classes or divisions.
