Prior to her representational duties with ICAO, Kerryn was the Deputy Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of the Australian Transport Safety Bureau (ATSB).

Kerryn is a commercial pilot and flight instructor with an Airline Transport Pilot Licence. She is a trained teacher and holds a Diploma of Transport Safety Investigation. She also has an Executive Masters of Public Administration with the Australia and New Zealand School of Government.

After joining the ATSB in 1995 as an air accident investigator, Kerryn worked in a wide range of agency operations including with a focus on investigations, safety analysis and research. Kerryn has led a number of significant agency projects including:

- the development of multi-modal legislation which culminated in the introduction of the *Transport Safety Investigation Act 2003*;
- the establishment of the ATSB as a Registered Training Organisation which enables the agency to meet its unique training requirements through the Diploma of Transport Safety Investigation; and
- the implementation of the ATSB's Safety Investigation Information Management System.

Kerryn also led the ATSB through its transition to both operational and functional independence on 1 July 2009. As the Deputy CEO, Kerryn was responsible for providing both tactical and strategic support to the ATSB's Chief Commissioner in relation to the agency's core safety investigation functions, its communications and education role, and in meeting its corporate responsibilities.
