#### What is an association?

- Individuals and organizations that have joined together united by a common purpose
- Not for Profit
- Self-governing
- Help members achieve common business and professional goals
- Provide members with tools to conduct their businesses or practice their professions more efficiently, effectively and responsibly
- Improve the well-being of members' professions by effecting change wherever it is needed

- Practice effective governance

- Recruit and maintain membership
- Exercise judicious use of finite resources

To influence aviation education policy at all governmental levels. To provide and nurture the linkage between college aviation educations, the aviation industry, and government agencies.

### Membership

#### Institutional

 Any accredited institution listed in the Higher Education Directory with an existing or planned aviation program or course offerings

#### High School

 Any accredited, secondary school with an existing or planned aviation program or course offerings

#### Professional

 An individual membership category and is open to all college, university, or high school faculty, administrators, or staff engaged in or interested in the furtherance of any form of aviation education

#### Associate

 An individual membership category and is open to any person with a sincere interest in furthering aviation education. This includes persons employed in the aerospace industry.





## Membership

#### Corporate

 Any organization or enterprise which has an interest in the purpose and goals of the UAA

#### Student

 An individual member, non-voting category, open to high school, undergraduate and graduate students with an interest in aviation

#### Honorary


 Non-voting, non-dues paying member. Open to those who have contributed to the advancement of the UAA's goals. Only upon recommendation of the President and majority vote of the UAA Board.

#### Fellow

 Voting member, non-dues paying. Bestowed upon past professional members. Consideration given to board members, committee chairs etc. Recommendation of the President and majority vote of the UAA Board.

- Board of Trustees (elected, volunteer positions)
  - President
  - President-Elect
  - Immediate Past President
  - Secretary
  - Treasurer
  - 9 Trustees
    - 3 Trustees represent the Corporate Member category
    - 6 Trustees represent the Professional Member category





#### Governance

- Professional Staff (paid positions)
  - Executive Director
    - Appointed by the Board of Trustees to serve as the Chief Operating Officer of the UAA
    - Provides leadership for carrying on the work of UAA, maintains corporate records, manage the finances, etc
  - Staff
    - UAA funds 2 full time personnel to assist with the daily work
- Financial Management
  - Not-for-profit association
  - Revenue is generated through:
    - Membership dues
    - Annual Fall Conference
    - Publication sales
    - Donations
    - Special Projects


## Benefits of Membership
