### **Purpose:**

- To select the prioritized "Roads" for the Region or State
- To reach agreement on a course of action to implement the GASR in that Region
- To propose solutions that can be monitored in accordance with the Roadmap process
- To achieve commitment from all parts involved

## Requirements:

- A balanced partnership between regulatory agencies and industry (airlines, ATM, airports). There is active participation by both at the appropriate level.
- Active participation by ICAO HQ and/or the ICAO Regional Office.
- An initial analysis is performed, either as part of the meeting, or in preparation for the meeting.

## **Requirements:**

- Focus should be on developing the action plan and go-forward strategy. The intended focus should be on the technical part of the plan. Other important issues such as funding should be addressed separately.
- Ideally, the meeting should include active participation of all ISSG stakeholders.
- A go-forward plan is developed and resources are committed to the plan.

## **Requirements:**

- The meeting results are published and are available for distribution to other regional implementation efforts.
- The Regional Implementation team agrees to provide regular (semi-annual, annual) progress reports to the ISSG and ICAO.
- Summaries will be provided to other organizations as agreed to by the ISSG, ICAO and the Regional Implementation Team.
- The regional plan and progress update are presented at the FSF/IATA/IFA International Air Safety Seminar.

## **Planning:**

#### Timing:

Ideally invitations should be issued 60 to 90 days before the proposed meeting date.

### Steering Committee:

Should be composed of the DGCA's, ICAO, ISSG members

### Participants:

ICAO, Member States, Airlines, Airports, Air Traffic Control Organizations, ISSG Members, Observers (Industry and Regulators).



#### **Planning:**

- Meeting Structure: (Opening session, Workshop, Closing Session)
  - Opening Session:
    - The opening plenary session is intended to provide participants with a broad, but fairly complete, overview of the roadmap.
    - The plenary session is not intended to provide a platform for stating positions or recommendations.
    - The presentations may also be used by the Steering Committee to help develop questions and targets for the subgroups.



## **Planning:**

- Meeting Structure: (Opening session, Workshop, Closing Session)
  - Workshop :
    - Multidisciplinary workgroups are formed, focused on the key areas.
    - Each group must have facilitators which will steer the discussion to keep the group focused.
    - At the end of each day a progress report is produced by each group.

## **Planning:**

- Meeting Structure: (Opening session, Workshop, Closing Session)
  - Closing Session :
    - A plan –including a proposal for self-sustaining GASR implementation- is presented and agreed upon.



### **Success Characteristics**

- An agreement is reached, regarding a process for GASR implementation action plan that involves (and includes commitment from) regulator(s) and industry.
- GASP/GASR plan is then followed by States, Industry, and Regional Organizations.




### **Success Characteristics**

- Safety enhancements are actively implemented.
