

## Speech by the ICAO Secretary General

## to the UNFCCC COP26 Transport Day Side Event

"Zero Carbon Transitions: Ambitions and Actions in the Transport Sector"

- 1. The effects of the COVID-19 pandemic have been felt strongly by aviation.
- 2. Global passenger traffic in 2020 fell drastically by 60% compared to 2019.
- 3. However, we have started to see the signs of a gradual recovery and with that, opportunities to build back better.
- 4. The recent IPCC report made it very clear: that we need to act and we need to act NOW.
- 5. Every fraction of degree counts, and every sector needs to act.
- 6. According to the IPCC, the international aviation sector accounts for approximately 1.3% of the world's man-made carbon emissions.
- 7. These are addressed through ICAO, as they are not covered by the Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) under the Paris Agreement.
- 8. Long term commitments are essential for the construct of decarbonisation pathways but should not shadow the need for immediate action.
- 9. ICAO States have been active in achieving 2% annual improvements to fuel efficiency, and carbon neutral growth.

- 10. 121 Member States have submitted State Action Plans on how to reduce CO<sub>2</sub> emissions from international aviation, including in-sector mitigation measures such as aircraft technologies, operational improvements, and the use of sustainable fuels. Despite the pandemic, the implementation of a global market-based measure the Carbon Offsetting and Reduction Scheme for International Aviation (CORSIA) is fully on track.
- 11. ICAO is now working with priority on the feasibility of a long-term global aspirational goal (LTAG) for international aviation, for consideration by our Assembly next year. To ensure a transparent and inclusive process for the LTAG work, ICAO is consulting on the matter with all its Member States and prior to the Assembly, ICAO will convene a High-level Meeting to facilitate the views of States.
- 12. ICAO is also fostering initiatives to enable new technologies and clean energy for a sustainable aviation sector, including promoting investments in electric and hydrogen-powered technologies and sustainable aviation fuels. Clean energy is key to the achievement of ambitious goals.
- 13. COP26 is critical in demonstrating that we are en-route to a better future. An ambitious outcome here will further encourage States to take an ambitious decision for international aviation at the ICAO Assembly next year, to complement the Paris Agreement objectives.
- 14. It is imperative to put in place the right policies and legal frameworks, infrastructure and access to clean energy amongst all sectors, with a view to achieving level playing field for an inclusive and effective green recovery.
