UNITED NATIONS SECRETARY-GENERAL WILL ATTEND ICAO'S 50TH ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS

MONTREAL, 2 December 1994 - Dr. Boutros Boutros-Ghali, Secretary-General of the United Nations, will be the main guest among hundreds of dignitaries from around the world who will be present at ICAO Headquarters, Montreal on 6 and 7 December 1994 for activities marking the 50th Anniversary of the signing of the Chicago Convention and the establishment of ICAO. The activities will take place at the end of the World-wide Air Transport Conference which began on 23 November.

The programme of activities (attached) begins with the closing ceremonies of the conference on 6 December at 1600 hours and continues with a cultural evening hosted by the Government of Canada. On 7 December there will be a special meeting of the ICAO Council, followed by a flag-raising ceremony, statements by delegations, the presentation of the Edward Warner Award (the world's highest award in civil aviation), and a press conference featuring the United Nations Secretary-General, the President of the ICAO Council and the Secretary General of ICAO. Later, Dr. Boutros Boutros-Ghali will address the ICAO staff and attend a lunch offered by the Canadian government.

ICAO was created in 1944 to promote the safe and orderly development of civil aviation in the world. A specialized agency of the United Nations, it sets international standards and regulations necessary for the safety, security, efficiency and regularity of air transport and serves as the medium for cooperation in all fields of civil aviation among its 183 Contracting States.
